Reports:

- TEEN ZONE – Donna Harris
 - Donna reported that a grant for \$4800 had been submitted to Walmart. If funded it would pay the cost of contracting with an ARNP for 8 hours per month. Kids Connected by Design would be the fiscal agent for the funds.
 - ARNP protocols have been developed and signed by the SLCHD medical director bringing TZ into compliance with nursing regulations.
 - Donna is compiling a Volunteer Handbook for new TZ volunteers
 - The resource guide to teen reproductive health services in SLC is compiled. We are asking each agency to go over their entry to insure that we are presenting accurate, up to date information. Once finalized the info will be available on the Teen Zone website and in written form for teens.

- Birds & Bees Presentation in Martin County
 - Jackie Copeland gave information about a recent event being held at the Martin County High School to educate parents about talking to their kids. The group discussed the possibility of holding a similar event in SLC.
 - We decided to get more information on how well the event was attended in Martin County before proceeding.

- WE R G.E.M.S. Program – Shantarra Houston gave a presentation on the Gems program.
 - A new privately funded program led by educators to empower girls
 - Uses an evidence based curriculum
